School of Japanese Language and Culture for International Students

Established in April 2012, this course is designed for international students hoping to enter undergraduate or postgraduate programs at Fukuoka University, or other universities in Japan. Classes on Japanese language and culture are included in a diverse curriculum, and because the course is offered on-campus students can take advantage of university facilities including library and cafeterias. A variety of financial assistance programs are available for this course, including various scholarships and assistance for admission, assistance in locating inexpensive student housing, and other
