Department of Pharmaceutics

The thrust of the Department's educational and research programs is to contribute to the health and welfare of the people by providing students with basic, clinical research related to the development and safe use of pharmaceuticals. Graduates become professional pharmacists, educators and researchers, equipped with sophisticated pharmaceutical knowledge and practical clinical skills, guided by their ethics and sense of responsibility as medical professionals. Students begin by studying the basics of pharmacology, then acquiring high-level knowledge in specialty fields so that, as graduates, they are prepared and able to make a real contribution.

In the 56 years since the Faculty was established, over 10,000 students have graduated to positions in diverse fields. The first Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences

building (Building 16) was completed in 2005, and the second (Building 17) in 2009, enhancing the educational and research environment. The six-year system for pharmaceutical education was established in April 2006 and graduated the fifth class in March 2016. The Department maintains a consistently high ratio of graduates advancing to postgraduate studies, and of students passing the national pharmacist examination.
